Odden moved, Layman seconded and motion carried unanimously to approve the minutes from the June 12, 2025 Technical and Citizens Committee meeting.

25TP017 – Approve the 2026-2029 Transportation Improvement Program – Final Report. Each year the Rapid City Area Metropolitan Planning Organization is required to develop the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). This is a four-year priority list and financial plan for highway, transit and intermodal projects. The TIP is intended to serve as a fiscal management tool to assist state and local agencies in matching transportation needs with resources. The TIP development, review, and approval process includes participation from affected public agencies, citizens' groups, private



transportation providers and representatives from various transportation entities. Harrington reviewed this final report.

Burns moved, Gallimore seconded and motion carried unanimously to approve the 2026-2029 Transportation Improvement Program – Final Report.

25TP018 – Approve the 2026 Rapid City Area MPO Meeting Dates and Location. Harrington reviewed the 2026 rapid City Area MPO Meeting Dates and Locations.

Gilkerson moved, Carlson seconded and motion carried unanimously to approve the 2026 Rapid City Area MPO Meeting Dates and Location.

25TP019 - Approve the Rapid TRIP 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan - Final Report. Rapid TRIP 2050 is the Rapid City Area Metropolitan Transportation Plan (formerly known as the Long Range Transportation Plan) and is developed to guide transportation planning activities and transportation facility development for the next 25 years. The goal of the Metropolitan Transportation Plan is to plan an efficient intermodal transportation system which maximizes the movement of goods and people, and minimizes hazards, costs, energy consumption, and pollution. This document is a requirement of the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST), and must be updated every 5 years. The Long Range Transportation Plan for the Rapid City Area was last updated in August 2020. This Rapid City Area Metropolitan Transportation Plan consists of two components. The first component is comprised of the 25-year traffic forecasts for the Rapid City Area Metropolitan Planning Organization Study Area used to identify future transportation needs. The second component is the development of the actual planning and prioritization elements within the Metropolitan Transportation Plan to satisfy those future needs. Harrington reviewed this final report. Brennan discussed the recommended studies from the report with Gilkerson advising on the MPO and SDDOT partnership in the upcoming Major Investment Study.

Burns moved, Gallimore seconded and motion carried unanimously to approve the Rapid TRIP 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan – Final Report.

Eick entered the meeting.
