







FY 2021 RAISE Planning Grant Request

The City of Box Elder, in partnership with Pennington County, is requesting approximately \$3 million in grant funding from the USDOT Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) Program for the preconstruction planning to complete a transportation improvement project providing a critical link in the transportation network between the Box Elder community, Rapid

City Regional Airport, and Ellsworth Airforce Base.

This project will address the necessary planning to address transportation infrastructure needs for urban reconstruction of Pennington County Highway 14/16 from West Gate Road to Liberty Boulevard, approximately 3.0 miles in length, and Radar Hill Road from Highway 14/16 to Old Calvary Road, approximately 1.5 miles in length, and rural reconstruction from Old Calvary Road to Highway 44, approximately 4.5 miles in length.

Summary of improvements:

- Highway 14/16 will be converted from three separate roadways to a single 5-lane urban section and additional turning lanes.
- The northern 1.5 miles of Radar Hill Road will be converted from a rural 2-lane to an urban 3-lane and will likely include surface improvements, curb, gutter, and sidewalk.
- Improvements to the southern 4 miles of Radar Hill Road from Old Calvary Road to Highway 44 likely includes turn lanes and shoulder widening to enhance connectivity and safety of nondrivers.
